INTRODUCTION - WHAT IS RIVERBANK?

Riverbank Arts Centre is the county arts centre based in Newbridge, Co. Kildare, funded by The Arts Council and Kildare County Council. Riverbank Arts Centre works in partnership with international, national and local artists to deliver an accessible and consistently high quality arts programme in an intimate environment. We provide a multi-disciplinary programme which includes theatre, cinema, comedy, music, dance, workshops and visual arts.

With a dedicated children's gallery and programming of high quality theatre and workshops for younger audiences, Riverbank is also committed to promoting early engagement with and access to the arts.

Riverbank Arts Centre is a producer and co producer of new work. We work closely with visual artists and theatre artists to develop and present work, with a particular focus on arts experiences for young people. We commission exhibitions, host residencies and have presented world premieres of work by leading theatre companies including Theatre Lovett, Monkeyshine, Moonfish, Fidget Feet Aerial Dance Company, Branar Téatar do Pháistí, Collapsing Horse, and Super Paua.

JULY: Near Faraway Places, an exhibition by Brianna Hurley and Thomas Barron, is a two person exhibition which brings together the work of artists Brianna Hurley and Thomas Barron to speak to the idea of 'places' that are both close and distant, familiar and unfamiliar, clear and indecipherable. Curated by Dominc Thorpe. Both artists are members of KCAT.

VISUAL ART ENGAGEMENT CURATOR: In March 2023, RAC appointed artist Martina McDonald as our Visual Arts Curator of Engagement, Learning & Participation. This role is to devise and develop an engagement and creative learning plan for the exhibitions programme. The Curator prepares materials, resources and exhibition assets for each exhibition in collaboration with the RAC marketing team and exhibiting artists. The curator also implements our EDI objectives and reaches out to new communities and to artists from diverse backgrounds.

Cover Illustration - Open Call

Since 2016, we've worked with numerous artists and illustrators by commissioning cover illustrations for our brochure. We offer a commission fee of €500 to three artists each year - in 2024 our cover artists were **Alexandra Craciun**, **Fiyin Oluokun** & **Jo Jo Gannon**.

FAMILY PROGRAMME

Presenting work of excellence for young audiences is a strategic priority for Riverbank Arts Centre. Irish venues coming together to commit strategically and in the long-term to programming and developing high quality arts experiences for underserved younger audiences, including babies, Early Years and children/young people with complex needs as a key part of their ongoing year-round programme.

VISUAL ART FOR CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE:

In 2024, Riverbank Arts Centre produced and curated a Visual Arts programme for children, presented in our Children's Gallery and offsite locations including exhibitions:

Jan-March: **Puffin Rock Habitats** - an immersive learning experience which introduces viewers to the rich diversity of plants and animals on Puffin Rock, and the intricate relationships within and between each habitat.

ENGAGEMENT: Illustrated talk for schools, family workshops, and numerous school tours.



April-June: Greg Sinclair - **Seashells** - invites viewers on a linguistic voyage through the whimsical world of tongue twisters. At the heart of this captivating display is a short video where Greg embarks on a linguistic adventure, reciting tongue twisters in various languages from Arabic to Urdu.

ENGAGEMENT: Illustrated talk for schools, school tours.

ORIGINAL EXHIBITION/COMMISSION

Sept: I Am the Wind - illustrated by Ashwin Chacko, poems selected by Lucinda Jacob and Sarah Webb. Based on the children's poetry book of the same name.

ENGAGEMENT: School talk, school tours, engagement sheet, recording of Ashwin Chacko creating the exhibition.







Nov/Dec: Caoimhe McGuckin - **Dwelling** - This exhibition explores the art of worldmaking; a process that nurtures agency, belonging and selfhood where household objects are reimagined to reflect the simple yet profound nature of children's daydreams. Co-commissioned with Kildare County Council Arts Service.





Riverbank Arts Centre works closely with Irish and international theatre companies, artists and co-producing partners, to present work particularly suited to schools.


In 2024, 6000 children from 42 schools attended events at Riverbank Arts Centre as part of a school trip/programme. A further 2000 children enjoyed events brought to their school by Riverbank, these included visual arts, workshops, live performances and collaborations with artists.


Riverbank Arts Centre is committed to providing:

Petrushka & More!; Riverbank continued its partnership with IFI Schools Programme to present seven screenings of four films: An Cailín Ciúin (Ireland, 2022, directed by Colm Bairéad); La Petite Bande (France, 2022, directed by Pierre Salvadori); 16 ans (France, 2023, directed by Philippe Lioret); Zu Weit Weg (Germany, 2019, directed by Sarah Winkenstette); Lola Rennt (Germany, 1998,



directed by Tom Tykwer); **Las Niñas** (Spain, 2020 Directed by Pilar Palomero); **Uno Para Todos** (Spain, 2020, directed by David Ilundain).

Riverbank continues to present an ongoing series of free in-venue and in-school **Fighting Words Creative Writing Workshops** led by Peirina Campbell. These workshops attract schools from across county Kildare including Clane, Kilcock and Celbridge. By the end of 2024 we aim to expand our programme to include students from local secondary schools to act as illustrators during primary school workshops.



In 2024, Riverbank Arts Centre increased its gallery tour programme, both for primary & post-primary TY & LC Gallery visits (with engagement packs) - e.g. we presented in-school workshops, facilitated by local artists, to coincide with Puffin Rock; Paula Barrett presented an exhibition tour of Bullet Points to 49 secondary school students; Kym Tracey hosted an exhibition tour to Erasmus students from Spain, Romania and Turkey.

WORKSHOP FACILITATION PROGRAMME: In collaboration with Puffin Rock Habitats, we hosted a training programme for artists to enable them to host in-school workshops with primary school students who had visited the workshops. Kate Escolin, Marta Ivanowska and Marta Golubowska availed of the training, which was extended to our Box Office team to provide further education on delivering tours of the exhibition.



In addition, Riverbank Arts Centre presented outreach/in-school programmes in association with partners including Music Network, Music Generation, Improvised Music Company and continued our **Creative Schools engagement** as Creative School Associate.

Outreach & Engagement Activities

Sing Me To The Sea by Anna Newell Theatre Adventures
Riverbank Arts Centre partnered with Enable Naas to present
Sing Me To the Sea. Sing Me to the Sea is an immersive
multisensory adventure for children and young people with
complex needs. It is performed in hydropools with 3 audience
members per show, each with an adult companion – with
everyone in the water!

Sing Me To The Sea was originally created in 2018 with funding from Wicklow Arts Office. Created in partnership with Enable Ireland and St Catherine's School.





Riverbank brought

Paul Curley's pilot project of **The Elephant in the Room** to Newbridge Educate Together in June and to St Mark Special School in September. The Elephant in the Room is a stand-alone installation, designed by Ger Clancy with Paul Curley, that aims to provoke conversation about things that are so apparent but yet we find difficult to talk about. During the period that the installation was resident in the schools, Paul was able to interact with the students gaining valuable insight, further developing this project.

RAC partnered with Music Generation Kildare for the **Teen Spirit Jazz Hub** programme, welcoming young musicians aged 13-18 to develop performance skills and explore jazz. A successful pilot term included workshops with world renowned musicians, including Europe's leading jazz saxophonist Linda Fredriksson, and the *Row E* ensemble performance at SubSounds Youth Music Festival.

Music Generation Kildare is managed by Kildare Local Music Education Partnership, led by Kildare and Wicklow Education and Training Board in partnership with Kildare



County Council and with support from Maynooth University Department of Music and Centre for Teaching and Learning.



STEPPING THE LAND, developed in partnership with Kildare County Council Arts Service and Riverbank Arts Centre and funded by the Arts Council/DAR Award, was a culmination to Philippa Donnellan's Kildare Dance Residency 2023-2024. Created with members of the local community and Griese Youth Theatre, it was performed on a farm in south Kildare. An intergenerational

dance piece, it gave a glimpse into stories of the land and habitats living and lost.

A Ray of Hope featured two large intergenerational community choirs with a special welcome for those living with dementia alongside their carers and wider communities. Past Times Community Choir and Voices of Spring, supported by Kildare County Council Arts Service, came together in Newbridge Town Hall to present an uplifting programme of festive music.

Artist Support Programme

Supporting artists and the creation of work is a strategic priority for Riverbank Arts Centre. We offer a variety of artist-centred residency and bursary opportunities including:

- a multi-annual residency and bursary programme to develop artistic practice
- short term residencies (though Open Call)
- and once-off residencies for artists
- commissioning or co-commissioning of new work by individual arts or companies, for ongoing development, presentation, or touring.

These residencies and bursaries provide practical support to artists to make work but also serve to allow the venue to engage creatively with our audiences and wider community through workshops and work-in-progress sharings. In many cases, these residency programmes enable Riverbank Arts Centre and our artists to garner feedback from audiences which can shape the development of the work and enrich our audience's engagement with the artform.

RESIDENCY SCHEMES



Navigator Programme: Riverbank Arts Centre partnered with Improvised Music Company on a 14-day residency for a musician in Autumn 2024. This residency offers a professional musician time and space to develop and perform work, and is an opportunity to grow audiences for improvised music, and also engage with local music artists and audiences. The artist selected for 2024 was percussionist and composer Éamonn Cagney. Along with developing and performing work Éamonn hosted a workshop for Music Generation Kildare students.

SHORT-TERM RESIDENCY OPPORTUNITIES: Emerging and established artists and companies were offered short term residency opportunities throughout 2024 (between 5-10 days in the venue, In-Kind support and mentoring). These residencies provide practical support to artists to make work but also serve to allow the venue to engage creatively with our audiences and wider community through workshops and work in progress sharings.

Other artists and companies we offered support to in 2024 include:



- **-Emma Finegan** developing a new autobiographical theatre work inspired by queer identity, being a Gaeilgeoir and living on the Curragh.
- **-Selma Daniel & Cibele Sabione**: exploring the singing voice & dance movement.
- **-Jess Rowell** developing a new piece of theatre, Other Worlds, for teenagers and young people with additional needs which included a showing at the end of the week.
- -Aoife Raleigh & Maria Corcoran research and development of their new show What's Watt? Thomas Johnston & Aisling Byrne development of a new intergenerational show, 'The Very Curious Céili', co-produced by RAC.

Dan Colley - Multi-Annual Residency

Continuation of four-year residency with theatre-maker Dan Colley, hosted by Riverbank Arts Centre and at various locations in Co. Kildare

Residency activity:

- Research and development of new theatre projects including **The Lottery.**
- Development of his own artistic practice through research and writing
- Development of the artistic practice of collaborating artists and providing paid employment opportunities for theatre artists and technicians throughout the residency period.

In addition, Riverbank Arts Centre acts as co-producer for National and international touring work which was created as part of this residency. In 2024, **A Very Old Man With Enormous Wings** travelled to leading festivals and venues, supported by Culture Ireland, including:

NETWORKS

Strollers - PROPEL

2024 saw the delivery of cycle 4 of the PROPEL Artist Development Programme. A newly established artist support initiative that utilises the network's existing infrastructure, resources, and wider network partnerships to support the sustainable development of independent theatre makers working within the Irish theatre and dance sector. The programme is delivered over three years, in three graduating cycles (early, mid, final). Supporting a maximum of three artists per year, over a three-year period. The aim of this programme is to strengthen the ecology of the Irish theatre sector by firstly supporting the development of new work by independent theatre makers, and secondly by supporting the long-term sustainable development of artists through capacity building and strategic professional development.

PROPEL Artists: Roisin Whelan (year 2 in 2023); Shane O'Reilly (year 1 in 2023), Choy-Ping Clarke-Ng 吳彩萍(year 1 in 2024), and Clare Monnelly (artist selected for 2025).

LIVE Network - promotes and explores literature as an artform, discovering new connections, partnerships, formats, and projects that connect RAC with new audiences and make literature a more visible artform within our venue. In addition, the Network seeks to support writers and literary makers in their ambitions to tour, workshop and engage with readers digitally and in person.

NOMAD - In 2024 Nomad announced two recipients for the Nomad Commission Award. They are Deirdre Kinahan and Xnthony (Anthony Keigher). Deirdre's play will focus on exploring Irish societies response to immigration while Xnthony is creating a satirical musical set in a mysterious rural village in the west of Ireland

LOCAL ARTS



Riverbank Arts Centre has a strong commitment to our local artists and arts organisations, with regular performances from Newbridge Drama Group, Riff Raff Drama Group, The Odd Theatre Company and Newbridge Musical Society. We continue to host a number of events as part of June Fest each year. This year **June Fest** presented Summer Sessions with Your Host Frankie Lane, the success of which led to Winter Medley, and they collaborated with local secondary schools to present School's Out for Summer.

Riverbank held several local art productions on its stage over the course of 2024, including: Stage Academy - Sister Act; Ballymore Eustace Concert Band; The Odd Theatre Company - Sunday in the Park with George; Newbridge Drama Group Presents Blithe Spirit (April) & By The Bog Of Cats (November), Riff Raff Drama Group Presents Secret Dilemma; Newbridge Musical Society - Now That's What I Call Music; The Odd Theatre Company - Hamlet & Sunday in the Park with George; Highly Strung - All Wrapped Up; Griese Youth Theatre - Double Bill & On the Big Screen; Kildare Youth Theatre - Back in the Day, King Lear by William Shakespeare; Crooked House Theatre Company - Milis (in collaboration with Newbridge Womens Shed) & Fáilte Anseo. In addition, Riverbank offers access to theatre artists/companies and engagement programmes for Kildare-based youth theatre companies throughout the year.
